SISTER ANGELINE DAL CORSO, MPF

Sr. Angeline Dal Corso, MPF, 101, died Thursday night, March 23, 2017, after a long illness, at St. Joseph Hall, Villa Walsh, Morristown, N.J.

The viewing will be held Monday, March 27, 2017, from 3:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. in the Saint Lucy Chapel at Villa Walsh, Morristown, N.J., followed by a Mass of Christian Burial at 4:00 p.m. celebrated by Rev. Ron Sordillo, chaplain for St. Joseph Hall. Interment will follow the liturgy at the Ave Maria Cemetery. Arrangements are by the Doyle Funeral Home, Morristown, N.J.

Born and raised in Trenton, N.J., Sr. Angeline entered the Religious Teachers Filippini on June 28, 1931, invested on July 3, 1932, and made her final religious profession July 31, 1935.

Sr. Angeline was awarded a BA degree with a major in English from the College of St. Elizabeth with graduate credits from Seton Hall University, Catholic University and Jersey City State College.

Sr. Angeline taught the elementary grades in various schools in the Archdioceses of Newark, N.J. and Hartford, C.T. the Dioceses of Trenton, Camden, Trenton, N.J. and Bridgeport, CT. Other roles assigned her in the area of education included reading specialist at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Jersey City, Queen of Peace, Maywood and St. Sebastian, Middletown, CT. She was principal in the Archdiocese of Newark, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Newark, St. Joseph, East Orange, St. Peter, River Edge, N. J. and in St. Sebastian, Middletown, CT.

Her ministerial service further included religious education where Sister served as CCD coordinator at St. Pius X Middletown, CT. She was a local Superior at St. Thomas, Southington, CT. and for five years director and superior at the Holy Land, Waterbury, CT, where she retired in 2009. When Sr. Angeline returned to Villa Walsh in 2010, she became a resident at St. Joseph Hall.

Everyone's life is filled with successes and challenges; accomplishments as well as the cross. Sister Angeline's strong faith and love of God allowed her to be thankful for God's gifts and also to live strong in faith. Her love of God and deep prayer life sustained her throughout her entire life.

Sr. Angeline was predeceased by her father, Arthur and her mother, Louise (Bosio) Dal Corso; three sisters who were Religious Teachers Filippini -- Sister Gilda, Sister Emma and Sister Victoria; Mary Dorsett and brothers, Arthur, Elmer, Albert, Benjamin. She is survived by loving nieces and nephews
